Course Description

The course of study will provide the student with a survey course in Western Civilization. The course will discuss the four cradles of ancient civilizations of Greece and Rome, the Middle Ages, and Modern History. A particular emphasis will be places on the development of World Religions, the rise of Nation States in Europe, the Renaissance, the French Revolution, the rise of Totalitarian States, and Communism. Some analytical reading and essay fundamentals will be reviewed.
